Sub-theme description. *

The Washburn University Center for Teaching Excellence would empower faculty to improve the quality of their teaching, resulting in an improvement of the quality of the education Washburn University students receive at Washburn University.

Faculty would gain increased understanding and ability to create and effectively utilize knowledge related to a wide variety of topics for both online and face to face teaching. The Center would create faculty work-shops, build an online repository of written and audio-visual resources, gather and disseminate information as well as aid and support faculty in adopting new teaching strategies and effective pedagogical practices. Examples of topics could include:

- · Course design
- · Strategies to engage a diverse student population
- · Learning outcomes based on Bloom's Taxonomy
- · Assignment construction
- · Assessment tools and documenting student learning
- · Instructional technology
- · ADA compliance

The Center for Teaching Excellence would have a physical presence on campus where faculty could meet and study. At least one full time staff person would coordinate the goals of the Center supported by other faculty exhibiting particular skills and who could be trained as mentors and peer coaches for faculty seeking to improve their teaching practices.
