

Navigate: Rules for Notes

DO	DO NOT
<p>Briefly summarize what was discussed as it relates to student success for reference by the student, support staff, and future advisors:</p>	<p>Summarize <i>everything</i> that was discussed. Notes are intended to briefly record recommendations, referrals, and follow-up plans.</p>
<p><u>Recommendations</u> – “Recommended student take MA116 because of her interest in engineering.”</p>	<p>Include unnecessary details: “Student said she has been having a good week and is especially excited about moving into a different apartment.”</p>
<p><u>Advice</u> – “Cautioned against taking 18 credit hours this semester, given student’s work schedule.”</p>	<p>Include personal/medical/sensitive information – see examples below.</p>
<p><u>Referrals</u> – “Referred student to Career Services.”</p>	<p>Include subjective opinions – see examples below.</p>
<p><u>Action Plans</u> – “Student plans to follow up with the Tutoring & Writing Center, and schedule an appointment with me after mid-terms.”</p>	

Summarize specific course recommendations	Report issues with specific instructors
<p>“Encouraged student to take HI111 as a general education course.”</p>	<p>“Student doesn’t like his MA090 instructor.”</p>
<p>“Recommended student take BI275 during the fall 2016 semester.”</p>	<p>“Student said PY100 professor has unfair grading policies.”</p>

Write fact-based, academic-related notes	Include speculation, subjective opinions, or judgements
<p>“Student is concerned about grades in two courses.”</p>	<p>“I don’t think she is very motivated this semester.”</p>
<p>“Student is considering whether his current major is a good fit. Helped him consider other options.”</p>	<p>“His personality isn’t a good fit for STEM fields. I think he’d feel more at home doing something artistic or creative.”</p>

Summarize obstacles to student’s academic performance	Include personal medical information or speculate on diagnoses
<p>“Student indicated transportation issues with getting to class. Referred to Metro Pass.”</p>	<p>“Student shared that they are homeless.”</p>
<p>“Student shared that they have been ill/are experiencing medical issues. Referred student to Student Health/Counseling Services.”</p>	<p>“Student expressed that they have COVID-19, and I think that they are also suffering from depression.”</p>

DO	DO NOT
Include notes about positive student behaviors	Include notes about negative student behaviors
<p>“Student came prepared for advising session with course plan filled out.”</p> <p>“He has spent time talking with two Sociology professors to learn more about potentially changing to that major.”</p>	<p>“She seems like she just blows off advising appointments. I can’t get her to be serious and plan ahead.”</p> <p>“He seems pretty uninformed about the real world after college. I think he needs to be more realistic.”</p>
