

Pre-Requisite Classes Requirements and Examples

Along with one of the degrees listed in our admissions criteria, there are 6 pre-requisite classes required to be eligible to go through the sonography program. These are:

- Communication (examples: English, composition, speech)
- Human Anatomy & Physiology I
- Human Anatomy & Physiology II (if combined, they must total at least 5 credit hours)
- Mathematics (examples: intermediate algebra, college algebra, statistics, trigonometry)
- Physics (examples: radiologic physics, general physics)
- Medical Terminology (if embedded in another course title, a course description must be provided to show that medical terminology was covered in the class).

Pre-reqs must be completed by the end of May preceding the August start date, if accepted. All pre-reqs must be taken for a letter grade, college credit and a C or higher is earned and this letter grade must be reflected on a college transcript.

Foreign Transcripts:

- All foreign transcripts must be evaluated on a course-by-course basis by WES or ECE, **no** exceptions.

Applicants residing in non-US country (other than Canada)

- Students residing outside the United States and Canada are not eligible for the Washburn University sonography program. United States Territories are also not eligible. However, there are other CAAHEP accredited online sonography programs that may have different admissions criteria. You can find those programs at www.CAAHEP.org.

Step two: Washburn University only accepts transfer credit for coursework completed at postsecondary institutions that are accredited by one of the following regional accrediting organizations.

Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges (ACCJC) Western Association of Schools and Colleges

- Higher Learning Commission (HLC)
- Middle States Commission on Higher Education (MSCHE)
- New England Commission of Higher Education (NECHE)
- Northwest Commission on Colleges and Universities (NWCCU)
- Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC)
- WASC Senior College and University Commission (WSCUC)

All pre-reqs must be taken for a letter grade, college credit and a C or higher is earned and this letter grade must be reflected on a college transcript.

- Continuing education courses do not count
- Courses from places like Straighter line, Study.com, etc. do not count
