CFCCC took Natural Science's feedback into consideration and CFCCC decided to approve the proposal "as is" to allow for more discussion with the larger CFC.
 - iii. Concerns were raised about students using this as a "convenient parachute" option. This would be hard on smaller programs.
 - 1. The program director of this new degree could serve as a "gate keeper" for such concerns.
 - iv. It was suggested that language in the proposed catalogue be updated specifying that the program director will work with students to make sure this program advances their specific goals.
 - v. It was also recommended that the catalogue contain language saying the BGS is not the same thing as a BA/BS.
 - 1. However, this may be a better idea for marketing rather than making this change in the catalogue.
 - vi. It was recommended that "interdisciplinary" be removed from the proposal as this is not an interdisciplinary degree. The BGS does not meet the requirements of an interdisciplinary degree.
 - vii. Changes were made to the proposed document: the word
 "interdisciplinary" was deleted. In addition, a sentence was added stating:
 "The program coordinator will discuss with students whether a more

traditional degree would better advance their personal and professional goals."
