Admission to the Professional Teacher Education Program for DEGREE SEEKING STUDENTS:

- Completion of 24 hours of university coursework, including ED155 and ED285 with an earned grade of A, B or C.
- 2.75 overall GPA **AND** a 3.25 or better GPA in the last 24 credit hours completed.
- A or B in EN101 **AND** A or B in the Math class required for one's major.
- No ACT or CORE test required.

OR:

Completion of 24 hours of university coursework at the time of application including:
ED155 – Teaching, Learning and Leadership **AND** ED285 – Educational Psychology

Successfully passing one of the following tests:

The CORE Academic Skills Test minimum scores: Writing (162), Reading (156) Math (150)
An overall score of 22 or better on the ACT **OR** an overall score of 1665 on the SAT

Secondary (6-12) and All levels (P-12) students must earn a grade of C or better in each content area or major class, from the approved degree plans of study, and have a ≥2.75 overall GPA

Additional Documents needed: TB skin test, KBI background check, Conduct Disposition Form, and Professional Reference Form. May accept TB test and KBI check from ED155 if within a 2 years period.

DEADLINES FOR FILING APPLICATIONS to the Professional Teacher Education Program are: February 1; June 1; October 1.
