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## Admission to the Professional Teacher Education Program for LICENSURE ONLY STUDENTS:

- 1. Completion of a baccalaureate degree from an accredited institution.
- 2. Contact a department advisor to Declare a Teacher Licensure Program (for example: all Elementary students contact Tara Porter, Department of Education Licensure Officer, a History education student contacts the History Department, etc.)
- 3. Completion of the 2 pre-admission courses:
  - ED 155 Teaching, Learning, and Leadership
  - ED 285 Educational Psychology
- 4. Secondary (6-12) and All levels (P-12) students must earn a grade of C or better in each content course, from the approved list on the Teacher Licensure Program Plans and as shown on the WU detailed audits.
- 5. Elementary students must earn a grade of C or better for each emphasis course.
- 6. Overall GPA of 2.75 or better for all completed courses.
- 7. Additional Documents: TB skin test, KBI background check, Conduct Disposition Form, and Professional Reference Form. May accept TB test and KBI check from ED155 if within 2 years.
- 8. APPLICATIONS ACCEPTED ONE YEAR PRIOR TO STUDENT TEACHING SEMESTER.
