TITLE: Washburn Panhellenic Council  
ORIGINATOR: Smith/Babcock Administration  
SPONSOR: Allocations Committee

WHEREAS: Washburn Panhellenic Council is requesting funding for Quarter Zips, and

WHEREAS: Washburn Panhellenic Council has fully complied with all applicable funding policies to this point in the allocation process, and

WHEREAS: Washburn Panhellenic Council is recognized by the Office of Student Involvement and Development as a registered student group of Washburn University, and

WHEREAS: registered student organizations are eligible to receive WSGA funds.

TITLE: No One Should Live in Fear  
ORIGINATOR: Legislative Director Hanes  
SPONSOR: Smith/Babcock Administration  
STATUS: Favorable – Diversity and Inclusion

WHEREAS: On March 16<sup>th</sup>, a single gunman went to three spas in Atlanta, Georgia and killed six women of Asian descent and two other people, and

WHEREAS: The Center for the Study of Hate and Extremism at California State University released findings in early March that showed hate crimes against Asian Americans had spiked 149% from 2019 to 2020, and

WHEREAS: Stop AAPI Hate, cataloged nearly 3,800 hateful incidents — not limited to crimes — during the first year of the pandemic, and

WHEREAS: These numbers show the increasing trend of hate crimes towards Asian Americans; however, there are several crimes that are unreported due to several cultural barriers, lack of trust with the police, or fears of repercussions from reporting.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

SECTION ONE: Washburn Student Government Association stands in support of the Asian American Pacific Islander community as well as our International students that attend Washburn University.

SECTION TWO: Washburn Student Government Association believes that each person deserves to live a life without fear of senseless acts of harassment, discrimination, and violence.

SECTION TWO: This legislation shall become effective upon passage.
