 - f. SB #191: Revision of Standing Senate Rules

- i. Parliamentary Sharp: Encourages people to amend the end if they do not like it. There are other important parts that deserve to be passed regardless.
- ii. Senator Lloyd: Motions to amend the last section.
 1. Vice Chairperson Motes: Confirms that it is 2 minutes at a time.
 2. Senator Whaley: Wants parliamentary Sharp to reiterate the changes.
 - a. There are small changes to make the document simpler. The main part is the discussion period.
 3. Vice Chairperson McGill: Is against them deleting this section. Thinks our culture on debate and change is negative.
 4. Chairperson Ross: Agrees with the amendment as it goes along with Roberts Rules. Explains that the guardrails are unnecessary.
 5. Senator Anderson: Agrees with chairperson Ross. Explains that Roberts Rules states that everyone has the right to debate if they wish. This protects the minority, therefore creating a time limit does not make any sense. Motion to previous question requires a 2/3 vote and so it already protects the minority.
 6. Senator Artzer: Agrees with Anderson and Ross. Emphasizes that we are currently debating on a bill and so therefore there is no need for guidelines. We only use move to previous questions when things become redundant.
 7. Senator Bourell: Wants to know that if we are done with debate then how they would end.
 - a. Parliamentary Sharp: The chair would look around to make sure there is nothing left to say, and they would move to vote.

8. Senator Barbery: Wants to know why its 10 minutes when most move to previous question usually happens after 10 minutes.
 - a. Parliamentarian Sharp: Thinks it should be after 10 minutes. He has seen people do it before 5 minutes, but it does not happen very often.
9. Senator Lloyd: In our standing senate rules, it says you can waive a standing rule. Thinks this is an unnecessary change as someone could just waive it.
10. Senator Smith: Thinks we should get rid of move to previous question. He thinks it has become weaponized.

VII. Public Forum I:

- a. Chief Enos, Campus Safety
 - i. Chief Enos is here to talk about the work of the Police Department. He has been chief since 2016. His role includes overseeing the safety committee that Dr. TLC is a member of. They look for ways they can make campus safer. In the safety committee this year, they did a risk assessment where they looked at the different threats the University might be facing. It looks at the risk as well as what the impact from that threat might be. Weather events are high on the list this year.
 - ii. Parliamentarian Sharp: Asks what the difference between an armed intruder and active shooter.
 - 1. An armed intruder brings a weapon onto campus while an active shooter is actively causing harm.
 - iii. Senator Yucesan: Wants to know what the percentages mean.
 - 1. It is part of a formula that maps out the different events that might occur. It is the relative risk compared to other events.
 - iv. Senator Smith: Wants to know why cyber-attacks are so high.

1. The university has never seen one yet, but surrounding areas have experienced these threats, and they people to be aware it is a possibility. The university has used a lot of resources to prevent cyber-attacks.
- v. There are packets that are in every classroom that explains procedures for every threat. The committee is looking to make sure the packet is up to date. They are wanting to make it a one-page document that is put onto walls, so it is more accessible. They want to make sure everyone on campus has access to this information. I-alerts tell people about life threatening emergencies on campus. It is in the moment information that people need to know about. You must sign up for I-Alert to get the information.
- vi. Senator Meier: Wants to know if I-Alerts are sent during active shooters as it could inform them of their location.
 1. This could potentially happen, but they are more concerned that students have the information. When you find out about an active shooter, you need to silence your phone.
- vii. Director Redington: You do not need to respond to the I-Alert call.
- viii. Chief Enos: Talks about campus security cameras. They have live views all over campus as well as all campuses such as Washburn Tech. They look for the latest motion and allow police to see it. If there is an armed intruder and they tell people to shelter in place, they use these cameras to detect the motion of the threat.
- ix. Vice Chairperson Motes: Wants to know if the patrolling officers have access to these videos in their patrol cars.
 1. Yes they do, although it is not very advanced, and that is something they are looking at updating.

- x. Senator Bourell: Wants to know what the Bullpen is.
 - 1. It is the place where they park their maintenance trucks.
- xi. Chief Enos: Washburn is a member of the real time crime center. It shows a call for service describing if officers have been dispatched and what the purpose of the call is.
- xii. Parliamentarian Sharp: Moves to extend public forum
 - 1. Motion is seconded
 - 2. Motion passes
- xiii. Senator Bourell: Wants to know if they can hear the dispatch calls.
 - 1. Washburn cannot hear the towns' calls, but we can see our own call system. Washburn's dispatch center has expanded extensively over the past decade.
- xiv. Senator Asfaque: Wants to know about the camera setup across the street of Morgan Hall.
 - 1. There are no cameras across the street since Washburn does not have jurisdiction.
- xv. Vice Chairperson Cattoor: Wants to know if the Caseys is safe.
 - 1. It is safer now due to all the cameras.
- xvi. Director Hammes: Wants to know about the non-emergency line as she called it once, and they did not respond. Also wants to know if they call 911 if WUPO will respond as well.
 - 1. It will call them both. There is 1 person on duty at a time at Washburn. There can be an overload if more than one person is calling. If you call 911, they will redirect you to WUPO.
- xvii. Senator Smith: Motions to extend public forum by 5 minutes.
 - 1. The motion is seconded.

2. The motion passes.
- xviii. Senator Smith: Interested in if they have access to facial recognition.
1. The city doesn't have any type of facial recognition. They are looking at getting newer equipment, and this could include recognition similar to facial recognition but not exactly. They have license plate recognition in the city.
- xix. Senator Barbery: Wants to know the extent of the department.
1. WUPO can basically do anything. If specialty forces are needed, they might need to call outside resources.
- xx. Senator Hixson: Motions to extend public forum by 5 minutes.
1. Motion is seconded
 2. Motion passes.
- xxi. Senator Hixson: Wants to know what the procedures are for ICE on campus and what they are able to access.
1. Chief Enos encourages students to call WUPO if they have concerns about outside individuals on campus. They cannot stop certain individuals, but they will be there to provide support. ICE can access any public space.
- xxii. Director Redington: Wants to know about the cameras they share.
1. There will be cameras added outside that they share.
- xxiii. Senator Whaley: Wants to know that if there is an ICE raid, would there be an I-Alert.
1. They would discuss it with the council, and it would depend on the circumstances.

VIII. Old Business I:

- a. SB #190: Funding Request Reform Act

- i. Senator Bourell: Wants to know about the bill
 1. Senator Smith: The bill makes funding request non-bills
- ii. Senator Artzer: How will students access records if they are not bills.
 1. Senator Smith: You can request information from the Budget Director.
 2. Senator Artzer: Would they get all the money
 3. Senator Smith: They have jurisdiction over the money.
- iii. Vice Chairperson Motes: Directs information to Senator Bourell. It would give allocations over 200,000 dollars.
- iv. Senator Anderson: See's this bill as rewriting WSGA history. Funding requests have always been bills because it is Senates job to distribute this money. If the concern is the amount of bills, there is no way to know if this concern will continue in the following years.
- v. Vice Chairperson McGill: Senators can talk to the Budget Director, and there are minutes. Says changing policies will not mean we are changing history.
- vi. Senator Barbery: Wants to know if there would be an opportunity to sit in during allocations since all committees occur at the same time.
 1. Senator Smith: Says you can be in allocations committee if you would like.
 2. Senator Bourell: Since they will no longer be bills how would they change how they are sent to allocations.
 3. Senator Smith: If there is a problem with allocations, that would be a problem with the funding process.
- vii. Chairperson Brungardt: Is against this bill. Says she will not stay as chairperson if this bill is passed as she does not want to oversee the huge amount of money.
- viii. Senator Lloyd: Says that every other university does what this bill says. Senate's oversight is the funding policy and allocations is bound to the funding policy and if they were to do something wrong, Internal Affairs would get involved.

- ix. Chairperson Ross: Allocations cannot have more than 40% of senate, that is not the majority therefore the majority of senate would not be hearing the discussion. Hearing this information is the purpose of senate and hearing it makes everything easier in the end.
- x. Parliamentarian Sharp: Yields time to Director Newfer
 - 1. If you show up to allocations twice in a row, you can vote on items in the committee.
 - 2. Parliamentarian Sharp: Reclaims time
 - a. Asks director Ginn how it would affect her job.
- xi. Director Ginn: Explains it would change the position specifically the amount of information they would have to record. The workload would increase significantly. There would be a lot more meeting. The funding policy is already complicated, and this bill would complicate it even more as the change is so rapid and it would confuse the student body.
- xii. Senator Asfaque: Asks Senator Smith what the check and balance system would be.
 - 1. Senator Smith: It is explained in the team's chat. Other committees aren't watched all of the time so why should allocations be any different.
- xiii. Vice Chairperson Motes: Motion to extend old business by 5 minutes.
 - 1. Motion passes.
- xiv. Vice Chairperson Cattoor: Wants to know if they thought about the positions they were changing while creating this bill.
 - 1. Senator Smith: Says he did not ask Director Ginn. He asked Chairperson Brungardt about her opinions.
 - 2. Vice Chairperson Cattoor: Yields time to Director Ginn.
- xv. Director Ginn: It impacts the director, chairperson, and committee. It would put all the blame on the committee. There were only 4 people in committee today so they would be giving over 200,000 to 4 people. This would give an incredibly high amount of power to the committee. The whole purpose of

senate would be discarded. There is a check for denied bills but not any for confirmed bills.

- xvi. Senator Hixson: Yields time to Director Ginn
 - 1. There are essentially no checks. The records would not be the same as it would no longer be a bill.
- xvii. Chairperson Brungardt: Motions to extend old business by 5 minutes.
 - 1. Motion fails.
- xviii. The bill fails.

WHEREAS, Chavanna Kerney is requesting funding for their attendance of the Trial by Iron powerlifting competition; and

WHEREAS, Chavanna Kerney has fully complied with all applicable funding policies to this point in the allocation process.

THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE WSGA SENATE:

WHEREAS, the Washburn Student Government Association (WSGA) is entrusted with the allocation and oversight of student activity fee funds; and

WHEREAS, the current WSGA Funding Policy has resulted in funding procedures that require students to attend prolonged meetings, regardless of whether their presence is necessary; and

WHEREAS, reforming the Funding Policy would promote equitable access to student funds while respecting the time commitments of hardworking students; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the student body that the WSGA Funding Policy be reformed to improve efficiency and accessibility.

THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE WSGA SENATE:

SECTION ONE: Purpose

The purpose of this legislation is to reform the funding policy to simplify the process for the Allocations Committee while making it easier and more accessible for students to request funding, ensuring that student activity fee funds are used efficiently to benefit as many students as possible.

SECTION TWO: Funding Policy Revisions

1. Chapter 4 of the Funding Policy is amended as follows, beginning at subpoint B:
 - b. The Budget Director shall forward all funding request materials to the Allocations Committee Chairperson, who will place the request on the agenda for the Committee's next meeting.
 - c. The Committee will vote to approve or deny the request. If an organization believes its request meets all funding policy requirements but is not approved, the Committee's decision may be appealed to the full Senate on the same day.
 1. The organization must send a representative or a previously approved written statement to the Allocations Committee meeting following the submission of its request, and the representative must speak on the request at that meeting. The Budget Director will notify organizations of the required meeting date and time during the week prior. This representative may not be a sworn-in member of WSGA.
 2. The Allocations Chairperson shall report to the full Senate the number of requests approved, and the total amount of funding allocated. The Chairperson may speak on the Committee's behalf regarding any questions about its decisions. Senators may request relevant documents from the Budget Director, provided that all confidential information pertaining to the requesting organizations is withheld.

SECTION THREE: Responsibilities

The Budget Director will work with the Legislative Director to update and redistribute the funding policy by February 8, 2026.

The Budget Director will inform all requesting organizations of these changes throughout the Spring 2026 semester and ensure the funding request form and website reflect the updates.

The Communications & Marketing Director will collaborate with the Budget Director to inform the student body of these changes through appropriate communication channels, including but not limited to social media and the blinky board.

SECTION FOUR: Effectiveness

This legislation shall become effective upon passage by the WSGA Senate, subject to the WSGA President's veto power.
