VII. Public Forum I:

- a. Kansas SB 244 Bathroom Bill, Dr. TLC
  - i. They are looking at changing the information about bathroom locations on the Washburn website. Some buildings do not have single use bathrooms, so they are looking at providing that information to the students via the website.
  - ii. Director Whaley: Wants Dr. TLC to explain why we are doing this.
    - a. A house senate bill recently passed has affected bathrooms, so they are wanting to make single person bathrooms more accessible.
  - iii. Senator Bourell: Explains to senate that there is a lawsuit in Kansas, and Senator Bourell is willing to share that information with others if they would like.
  - iv. Senator Anderson: Wants to know what would happen if Washburn doesn't comply with the changes of the bill.

- a. They are only trying to inform right now.
- b. Senator Bourell: Consequences from non-compliance are complaint driven.

#### VIII. Public Forum II:

- a. Washburn University Shared Governance Policy, Dr. TLC
  - i. The Washburn Board of Regents wants to make sure that Washburn is committed to shared governance. The task forces consist of many Washburn Professors, deans, and others. They are looking at a draft that will provide a guiding framework defining responsibilities and roles for decision making. It establishes accountability and guidance. They want feedback from students; information and questions can be directed towards Renee Burlingham.
  - ii. Director Redington: Wants to know if students aren't included in this because it doesn't serve them.
    - a. Everything they are doing is for the students.
  - iii. Vice Chairperson Cattoor: Asks if Renee is the only place they want feedback.
    - a. Yes
  - iv. Director Carpenter: How does this policy benefit students.
    - a. It helps with the decision-making process. It shows that everyone is working together when making decisions.
  - v. Senator Anderson: Asks if there is specific language explaining that WSGA is important.
    - a. You would need to email Renee.

#### IX. New Business II:

- a. SB 2025-26 #231: Cost-Neutral Position Changes Act
  - i. Director Newfer: Changing the hours of Legislative and SAB director from 20 to 15 hours. These hours will be transferred to a new 10-hour role called Director of Operations.
  - ii. Chairperson Smith: There used to be an Admin Assistant, and this new role sounds very similar. That role was dissolved as they didn't have much to do. The people in the position felt less than other cabinet members.
    - a. Director Newfer: The old title sounded demeaning, and the Director of Operations will help with a lot of other tasks that directors might not have time to accomplish.
  - iii. Senator Smith: Asks Director Newfer why this is necessary and why they can't put more responsibilities on chair people.
    - a. President Coulter: Previous Chairperson Brungardt said

she would not want to take on extra responsibilities as they don't have the resources for that.

- b. Senator Smith: Suggests that they provide other incentives for chair people for them to do it.
- iv. Senator Artzer: Yields time to VP Clark.
  - a. Many people have mentioned that they believe that another role is needed but not an entire role, so this new position will help with a lot of different things around the office. They would like to try this with different responsibilities.
- v. Senator Anderson: Is concerned that the Director of Operations might become a person that plays catch up for other directors that aren't doing their job.
- vi. Vice Chairperson McGill: Some chair people might want extra responsibilities, so Brungardt's opinions are not an overall consensus. Asks if the new stipend will help with catch up if senators are required to do more work to receive it.
  - a. Director Clark: The stipend resolution will have a specific criterion, and there will be expectations, and those will come later. Senators cannot take on a director's type of work since they only work one hour a week, and it can't be handed around to different people all the time.
- vii. Director Carpenter: If this does not pass, would cabinet remain the same?
  - a. Director Newfer: That's what would happen. They would still want the legislative and SAB positions to be moved to 15. This is needed for the work that needs to be done.
- viii. Senator Bourell: Moves to previous question.
  - a. The motion is seconded.
- ix. The bill passes
- b. SB 2025-26 #232: Cabinet Position and Committee Name Change
  - i. Director Whaley: They want to change SAB back to DEI. We are not funded by the state, so we would not lose funding.
  - ii. Senator Bourell: The name change to SAB has created a lot of confusion. This change would also be a better representation of the people they are helping.
  - iii. Senator Artzer: Asks Director Whaley if no one receives federal funding.
    - a. Director Whaley It is specifically WSGA that doesn't receive funding.

- b. Dr. TLC: They could be contacted by the state, and funding could potentially be affected
      - c. Senator Artzer: Moves to table the bill until next week.
    - iv. The bill is tabled for one week.
  - c. SR 2025-26 #010: A Resolution Recognizing Washburn University Men's and Women's Basketball Teams for MIAA Championships and NCAA Tournament Appearances
    - i. Senator Lloyd: Both men's and women's basketball won their conference, and this resolution congratulates them for their hard work.
    - ii. Senator Anderson: Sko Bods!
    - iii. Senator Artzer: Moves to previous question.
      - a. The motion is seconded.
    - iv. The bill passes
  - d. SR 2025-26 #011: Senator Stipend Proposal
    - i. VP Clark: When Clark was Special Events Director, she saw many senators doing hard work and wants them to be rewarded for all their hard work. The money will come from the University and not the student activity fee. Some people have had to leave WSGA as they have work and cannot give up the money they would have made.
    - ii. Senator Artzer: Yields time to Director Hammes.
      - a. One of Hammes's friends had to leave WSAG due to financial reasons and doesn't want to see that happen to other people, so she supports this resolution.
    - iii. Parliamentarian Sharp: Wants to reward senators. Asks how the stipend will work. Thinks the criteria should be high so people do not join for the wrong reasons.
      - a. VP Clark: This will be received at the end of each semester. There will be a policy created if the University agrees to fund this.
    - iv. Senator Anderson: Agrees with Parliamentarian Sharp.
    - v. Vice Chairperson Cattoor: Asks if the new Director position will be getting this.
      - a. VP Clark: This will not be going to cabinet positions. The Chief of Staff will be responsible for tracking the information. The criteria would be higher than it is now.
    - vi. Senator Adhikari: Some of her friends wanted to join but didn't think there were enough benefits. This stipend would motivate others to join. Would it be a check or go through tuition?
      - a. Clark: It would potentially be a reimbursement.

- vii. Vice Chairperson McGill: Sometimes other people have other things that might not allow them to join. So how would getting this at the end of the semester help at all?
  - a. VP Clark: It would have to be at the end, otherwise they wouldn't be able to track. There is still value knowing this money would be coming to students.
  - b. Vice Chairperson McGill: Yields time to Director Newfer.
  - c. Director Newfer: Other schools do this and give them a lot more money. If people are just here for the money, they are still here to help.
- viii. Chairperson Ross: There were only 19 people on the ballot this year, so this would increase the probability of people wanting to join senate. It also might help with the retention of senators.
- ix. Senator Asfaque: Would chair people get this?
  - a. VP Clark: They would work that out. They are looking at saying yes that chair people would get the stipend as well. Doesn't view WSGA as volunteer work and is why VP Clark proposed this stipend.
- x. Senator Bourell: A lot of people don't have the opportunity to be in senate and can't sacrifice their job. This would help others in different backgrounds of people who don't have a ton of support. Senator Bourell thinks this stipend is strictly for opportunity.
- xi. Senator Smith: Would support this only if there aren't cost increases in other places.
  - a. VP Clark: This money would come from the University budget, so the student fee would not increase.
  - b. Senator Smith: This would still be a cost increase for the University. We could raise the student fee to allow for the stipend. There are things we could do to get this.
- xii. Vice Chairperson Motes: Moves to previous question.
  - a. Motion is seconded.
  - b. Motion fails.
- xiii. Senator Barbery: This is only a resolution, and our money comes from taxes, and the increase would only be a tiny bit. Doesn't see a negative from raising anything.
- xiv. Senator Lloyd: This is only a resolution, and it would just say that you approve of it.
- xv. Chairperson Ross: Thinks this should be a unanimous vote to show our president that it is important to us.
- xvi. Senator Hixson: Has full faith in VP Clark.
- xvii. Senator Bourell: Our Alumni are very generous and might be willing to help us with this stipend.

- xviii. The bill passes unanimously.
- e. SR 2025-26 #012: Advocating for the Rights of Washburn Students
  - i. Senator Anderson: This resolution is to help with immigration concerns. This will help serve all students across campus. The purpose of this bill is to show students that we are protecting them and tell our administration that this is important to us. This would have Washburn give protection to students. There are a lot of gray areas of who can access student records. WUPO can access this information, so this resolution asks that the information they share is limited.
  - ii. Vice Chairperson McGill: Thinks WSGA should be political.
  - iii. Vice Chairperson McFan: Is glad Anderson took action.
  - iv. Senator Bourell: Yields time to Director Whaley.
    - a. Helped write this resolution. Students deserve privacy.
    - b. Senator Bourell: There are a lot of ICE raids that are not being conducted correctly, so ICE agents could potentially come.
  - v. Senator Lightbourne: Was at KU when ICE came. Lightbourne is an international student and is sad that Washburn doesn't have a stance on this when it can hurt students.
  - vi. Senator Adhikari: Is also an international student and explains that there is always a fear for international students that they might be questioned. Even when here legally some still have the fear that they might have trouble with ICE agents.
  - vii. Senator Smith: The university follows the law, so the University shouldn't demand policies that they do not have. Doesn't think this is what WSGA is for. If this was a different area, students wouldn't care. Thinks this is put in the wrong place and shouldn't be considered by WSGA.
  - viii. Vice Chairperson Cattoor: This resolution isn't demanding it is just telling the Washburn administration that this is important to us. Yields time to Director Carpenter.
    - a. This legislation is important to show that WSGA is here to support our students.
  - ix. Senator Artzer: Yields time to Director Hammes.
    - a. This represents our students as we have a lot of different students and this will help our students.
  - x. Senator Barbery: Nothing has ever changed by staying quiet. This is a serious matter, and we shouldn't take it lightly. We need to show the University that we are here to help and create change.

- xi. Senator O'Leary Worsley: Explains that Washburn has been having discussions about plans with ICE. It's important that the University creates a statement as they have some plans. ICE has been going against the law, so we need to share resources with students.
- xii. Senator Hixson: This could lead to an escalation, but we are a smaller school so ICE could come, and we need to plan for it.
- xiii. Senator Anderson: Says this is a really important thing, and we need to create precedent and show that we support our immigrant students.
- xiv. Senator Asfaque: Wants to know if they can always access public spaces. Asks if classes are public spaces?
  - a. Senator Bourell: Anyone can be in public spaces, but they have to be in compliance with WUPO. Although and ICE agent would have to be accompanied by WUPO they would most likely not follow that rule.
  - b. Senator Anderson: Residential halls are examples of private spaces.
- xv. Chairperson Ross: Yields time to Director Newfer:
  - a. Supports this and would issue something in support of it if it doesn't pass. This is America and we can talk about controversial things.
- xvi. Senator Meier: Supports this bill and says that being in WSGA means we need to support our students.
- xvii. Vice Chairperson Motes: Moves to previous question
  - a. Motion is seconded
  - b. Motion passes
- xviii. The bill passes.

The hourly wage shall be the median university payment rate (\$11.00) plus \$2.60 per hour (\$13.60).

SECTION TWO: Chapter I, Section 3 of the Cabinet Policy shall be amended to read:

This role shall facilitate at least one diversity focused training each academic year. Collaboration, support, and community building are the focuses of this role. At the end of term, a report shall be written and made available to the Senate detailing the year's activities and suggestions for the future.

SECTION FOUR: Chapter I of the Cabinet Policy shall be amended to include a Section 6 titled **"Section 6. Director of Operations"** that will read:

This role is responsible for ensuring that daily WSGA operations are efficient and coordinated. Key responsibilities include assisting with the Allocations process, coordinating public communications, assisting with administration priorities, and supporting the implementation of Senate legislation. This Director works closely with Cabinet members and Senate leadership to ensure initiatives are executed smoothly.

This role is responsible for many internal functions of WSGA depending on capacity of cabinet work. The Director of Operations shall hold ten scheduled office hours per week during the academic year. At the end of term, a report shall be written and made available to the Senate detailing the year's activities and suggestions for the future.

SECTION FIVE: This legislation shall become effective upon passage by the WSGA Senate, subject to the veto power of the WSGA President as outlined in the Constitution.

TITLE: Advocating for the Rights of Washburn Students

STATUS: Student Accessibility and Belonging - STATUS

WHEREAS, on February 27, 2026, the Lawrence Times reported that Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) arrested and detained people on the University of Kansas campus; and

WHEREAS, ICE operations and reports cause confusion on campus as students can be unsure of their legal rights and protections against being detained, arrested, or deported by ICE; and

WHEREAS, Washburn University provides resources from the ACLU of Kansas and Informed Immigrant on its website that informs students of their rights and protections; and

WHEREAS, Washburn must continue to uphold the rights and protections of all students, regardless of immigration status.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE WSGA SENATE:

SECTION ONE: Guarantee that Washburn University shall prohibit the voluntary sharing of student records or status information with ICE, affirming compliance with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA).

SECTION TWO: Affirm that ICE agents shall not be permitted to enter non-public campus spaces without a judicial warrant.

SECTION THREE: Ask that the Washburn University Police Department will not inquire about a student's immigration status, unless pertinent to an ongoing investigation.

SECTION FOUR: Request that local immigration resources be added to Washburn's website and that the website provide updates on legislation that could impact immigrant students.

SECTION FIVE: Upon passage, this resolution shall be forwarded to President Mazacheck, the Washburn University Administration, the Office of Student Involvement and Development, Residential Living, and the Washburn University Police Department for review and consideration.

SECTION SIX: This legislation shall become effective upon passage by the WSGA Senate, subject to the veto power of the WSGA President as outlined in the Constitution.
