SENATE BILL no. 24-25 #110

TITLE: Legislative Director Hours Extension ORIGINATOR: Burdick/Wood Administration SPONSOR: Burdick/Wood Administration STATUS: Internal Affairs Committee – Pending

WHEREAS: The current workload as designated by the By-laws is more than what can be done in the span of 15 hours per week for the Legislative Director, and

WHEREAS: the current responsibilities of the Legislative Director are Elections, Higher Ed Day, First Gen Advocacy Day, and consult on all legislation for Senate, and

WHEREAS: WSGA strives to be a fair and equitable organization and wishes to see these events carried out as effectively as possible and not rushed.

THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE WSGA SENATE:

SECTION ONE: The WSGA Legislative Director shall have the responsibility to maintain at least twenty (20) scheduled office hours per week.

SECTION TWO: The Legislative Director grant shall be up to 640 hours multiplied by the median payment rate plus \$2.35 per hour (\$13.35). The 640 hours shall be allocated with 320 hours in the fall and 320 hours in the spring to be paid on the same time frame as a Washburn Student Worker.

SECTION THREE: This legislation will expire at the end of the Burdick/Wood administration.

SECTION FOUR: This legislation shall become effective the pay period after passage and bearing the signature of the WSGA President and Vice President.
